A Museum on display!

Exhibition

"Leisure times for the girls in care at the Good Shepherd" from 31st March to 30th June 2023

Created by the Archives department of the Europe BFMN Province to mark the opening of the Museum in 2016, this exhibition was reinstalled there for a few weeks. The eight themed panels (sport, holiday camps, singing and music, etc.), showing the development



and diversification of leisure activities in the lives of the girls in care during the second half of the 20th Century, were accompanied by a video extract from a show put on by the boarders in Pau in 1989.



For this repeat performance, two disguises of the residents of the Nazareth establishment (Angers) were added to the written and visual material, thanks to the loan of two mannequins from the Maine-et-Loire Departmental Archives.

The local radio station RCF interviewed Sibylle Gardelle, archivist for the Europe BFMN Province and who had helped create the exhibition in 2016, as part of the "Vitamine C" programme broadcast on 21 st April. You can listen to the interview in full by clicking on the link:

Around a hundred people visited the exhibition over a three-month period, including 54 people on the occasion of the 25 th anniversary of the Bon Pasteur Accueil association on 1stApril.



One Object, One History

The medallions of St. Mary Euphrasia



These three wooden frames are souvenir medallions, which were placed on the wall of St. Mary Euphrasia's office.



Personal objects, at a time when "mourning jewellery" (rings, brooches, medallions or bracelets) was fashionable, they commemorate four people close to the foundress, who helped and supported her greatly in the early days of the congregation. They all died during the 1840's, the decade that saw the growth and international expansion of the congregation:

Medallion of Sister Mary of St. Theresa of Jesus de Couëspel, who died in 1848

Sister Mary of St. Chantal of Jesus, born Joséphine Milcent, made her profession in 1833 at the age of almost 50. She provided considerable material and financial support to the house of Angers, where she became bursar.

In 1837, she was appointed Assistant General to St. Mary Euphrasia.

Sister Mary Theresa of Jesus, born Mélanie Paulmier, got to know St. Mary Euphrasia during her husband's final illness.

After her profession in 1836, she became successively foundress of communities in Bordeaux, Rome, Nice, Toulon and Genoa, then Assistant General. On her death, St Mary Euphrasia said she had lost " The most dear, the most beloved, the most pious, the most attached of my daughters."


la Roche, who died in 1847.

These medallions are the work of Sister Mary of St. Angelica of the Cross, whose surname could not be identified. They consist of drawings of tombstones and glued elements (including probably feathers) representing trees. The one dedicated to Sister Mary of St. Chantal Cesbron de la Roche shows a Sister of the Congregation kneeling in prayer.
